

Thank you for your interest in "Writing for International Publication".

This workshop attempts to address your specific individual needs, which is why I ask you to complete a number of small reading and writing tasks beforehand, as outlined below:

1. Select two international peer-reviewed journals in which you wish to publish. In each journal, find an article whose structure and style you find appropriate to your own field of research. (Note: these articles should not be authored by very famous researchers.)
2. Compare the structure of Introductions/introductory sections in your two sample articles to the CARS model (Swales, 1990; attached and available on Mondo under Resources). Write a short analysis (about 200 words) outlining any similarities or differences.
3. Think of **one research topic** and write **two different abstracts** (up to 200 words) that you would submit to the two selected journals in your field of research (as mentioned in task 1). Consider how you would adapt your writing to different specialized audiences/purposes.

Please do not forget to bring along paper copies of the two sample papers, your analysis of the two introductions, and your own two abstracts for different journals.
